
This year also marked a significant milestone as we were approved to become a Medicaid provider, broadening our capacity to touch more lives.



# **Meet Rodney**

Rodney, a Navy Veteran, once enjoyed a life filled with success and stability. However, his world was turned upside down in 2021 following two heart attacks in quick succession. These medical emergencies drained his life savings, leading to the loss of



his house. Rodney was then forced to live in his car until it was repossessed. Amidst these challenges, Rodney found a glimmer of hope when he moved into housing provided by VOAF.

Unfortunately, Rodney's streak of bad luck continued when he was struck by a car while coming home from the bus stop, resulting in weeks spent in the hospital and an extended five-month recovery in a nursing home. During this time, Teresa, a dedicated clinical team member from VOAF, made regular visits to instill hope and support in Rodney. Despite living at the VOAF housing for only three weeks before the accident, Rodney had begun the process of organizing his paperwork to access his veterans' benefits. Teresa's commitment didn't waver; she went above and beyond to ensure Rodney received the care and assistance he needed.

VOAF committed to ensuring that when Rodney was able to leave the nursing home, an apartment would be waiting for him. VOAF continued to process his paperwork and worked tirelessly to secure permanent housing for him. Rodney expressed feeling safe with VOAF, appreciating the support that provides him the strength to keep going.



When faced with difficulties again, Sara reached back out to VOAF. Acknowledging her passion for writing, the VOAF team, including Melissa, organized a special event—a book signing and meet-and-greet to celebrate her latest work. Held at a local community store, this event gathered community members to support Sara.



Sara's story and the event symbolize the profound impact VOAF has on lives. It's a reminder of the therapeutic power of creativity, the resilience of the human spirit, and the importance of continuing to provide spaces where stories of struggle, recovery, and hope can be shared and celebrated.

After the devastating loss of her daughter-in-law in a terrible car accident and the prolonged hospitalization of her grandson, Ana sought comfort in giving back, sparking a wave of compassion that rippled across our entire community.

Ana's deep bonds with the residents she serves, formed through dedicated care and mutual respect, became the foundation for a call to action that resonated across the entire Puerta del Sol community along with VOAF staff and residents statewide

Her initiative? To collect and deliver Easter baskets for the children at Joe DiMaggio Children's Hospital. This simple act of kindness became a heartwarming campaign, culminating in the delivery of over 130 baskets to the hospital, a clear demonstration of what can be achieved through community spirit and collective effort.

Ana's unwavering commitment, even amidst her own family crisis, is a testament to the caliber of staff at VOAF. More than just colleagues and caretakers, the VOAF team operates like a family—a family that extends its care far beyond its walls.

# July-August 2023

The program provides up to 90 days of supportive living and recovery services to eligible male unhoused veterans, with permanent housing plans. This collaborative effort not only enhances the facility but also significantly uplifts the lives of those who have served our country.



### **November-December 2023**

Raymond James selected VOAF as their charity of choice for the annual Holiday Angel Giving Tree. Gifts were distributed statewide to those that we serve, spreading joy and blessings this holiday season.



## January- February 2024

Move-In Day at Innovare Apartments was a milestone event. Formerly unhoused residents of St. Petersburg transitioned into their new homes, each space brought to life with warmth and the heartfelt contributions of our donors. Innovare offers 50 affordable housing units, including those specifically for extremely low-income individuals, reinforcing our dedication to supporting those in greatest need.

# March-April 2024

More than 400 volunteers descended on the VOAF's Punta Gorda Veterans Village, for a blitz of upgrades and renovation to the exterior and interior.





The grand opening of Innovare Apartments marked a new beginning, providing 50 affordable homes to St. Petersburg's fresidents.



### May-June 2024

VOAF, in collaboration with Dinontas, hosted an event at Ocala Ritz Veterans Village, providing formally unhoused veterans with fresh meals, new clothes, and haircuts. This initiative reflects the deep appreciation and support for veterans, with Ocala Ritz Veterans Village housing over 1,200 veterans since 2012.




